**SUBJECT:** Employee Suggestions for Budget Reductions Categorized

The following suggestions were received from employees throughout the district and have been summarized and categorized but not altered. Some suggestions cross over and are shown in more than one category.

**Energy and Utilities**

1. Decrease energy usage by reviewing heating, cooling, and all other energy usage; set thermostats to 68 degrees for heating and 72 degrees for cooling; install low-wattage light bulbs at all sites through the district; set electrical systems like lighting and air conditioning at all schools to turn off at night, weekends, and breaks
2. Decrease water usage; perhaps replacing ornamental lawns and replace with drought-tolerant shrubs and ground cover; install low-flush toilets; do a districtwide check for leaky faucets/sprinklers
3. Re-introduce S.A.V.E. program at schools not currently using it; not turn all the lights on in classrooms and offices; lights in school hallways used only on rainy days
4. Eliminate use of small refrigerators in offices/classrooms as they are not energy efficient
5. Turn down air conditioning at Ed Center (conference rooms too cold)
6. In air conditioned areas, keep doors leading to outside closed

**Conservation of Resources (non-energy)**

1. Standardize printers throughout district to save on toner supplies; refill toner cartridges at a fraction of the price purchased new

2. Decrease paper usage by increasing electronic communication, including intra-school; one public copy of meeting notes posted in staff lounge; eliminate hard copies of Power Point presentations
3. Put controls on copying machines at school sites that set maximum quantities for each teacher; send more copying to district print shop; use half sheets for short memos; be exact with number of copies made/ordered to reduce waste
4. Limit homework packets and consider homework objectives/plans instead
5. Go “green” and go paperless everywhere possible
7. Mandatory recycling of paper, cardboard, aluminum, Styrofoam, plastic shopping bags (which Wal-Mart will redeem them) and return them for money to be used by the school
8. Cut back on supplies; ask for parent/community donations; purchase small pencils used at golf courses; instead of supplying all students with basic supplies, just give them to students who haven’t brought their own
9. Consider putting project specialists at schools with less than 400 enrollment
10. Print on both sides of paper in all duplication
11. Cut back on laminating (saves money and landfills)
12. Eliminate bottled water and electric coolers for employee use
13. Turn off sprinklers in areas where there is no vegetation; replace all unnecessary landscaping that requires watering or at least replace with drought-resistant plants

### **Employee-related, Contractual**

1. Employees pay for dependent health benefits; offer HMO free to employee and family but have a payroll deduction toward the cost of PPO for employee and family; employee pay toward dental and/or vision insurance
2. Offer 2+2 Golden Handshake
3. Reduce work year for administrators by 5 days; administrators take a 1, 2, or 3% salary reduction
4. No Maintenance overtime (incentive for working faster)
5. Vote down 2 percent raise with a district commitment to restore increase during better economic times

6. Reduce the number of employees for whom the district is paying benefits if they have a spouse also working in the district and receiving benefits; give employee a stipend for not being fully covered for benefits by the district if they are covered by a spouse
7. If 2 % raise is accepted, make it effective January 1, 2008, instead of July 1, 2007
8. Delay by one year giving classified substitutes 2% raise
9. If district cannot afford a Golden Handshake incentive for retirement, offer employee-only medical coverage for employees who have 18 years of service in the district for two years

### **Instructional**

1. Reduce/eliminate some district-mandated assessment tests such as math and language arts benchmarks, summatives, theme skills tests, etc.
2. Teach the Positive Action program from the manual without purchasing consumables that support the program; eliminate all consumables; have students use journal format instead of workbooks for social studies and keep only one master set; eliminate science consumables because teachers do their own experiments
3. Make summer Reading First trainings optional, especially for veteran teachers
4. Consider eliminating K-3 class size reduction
5. Reconsider full inclusion for SPED students; combine caseloads for RSP/SDC teachers to equal 28; add another aide or add two aides per teacher, reducing the need for teaching positions
6. Eliminate middle school benchmark sets for each class
7. Reduce kindergarten teachers and have only one teach both AM and PM classes
8. No curriculum adoptions until California's budget is in better shape
14. Reduce or eliminate BTSA requirements; instead provide new teachers support at their site through mentor teachers
15. Reduce or eliminate the need for subs for teachers doing DAIT visits; reduce or eliminate all requirements for teachers to be out of classroom requiring subs
16. Eliminate Edusoft if it's costing money

17. If eliminating class size reduction, start at third grade first and progress down to kindergarten if budget shortfalls span multiple years
18. Eliminate Safe & Drug Free Advisory Committee and funnel funds into core curricula
19. Eliminate ELD coaches; reduce all coaches
20. Offer certification programs at the district instead of requiring conference attendance
21. Have two sets of math texts (one for school, one for home) if it reduces the cost of printing
22. Eliminate unnecessary at-will contracts
23. Eliminate professional development day for Leadership Team or get corporate sponsorship

### **Doing Things Differently**

1. Eliminate things that require extra-hour pay for teachers like Anytime School, etc.
2. Return teachers on special assignment to the classroom; limit teachers on special assignment to no more than one per site
3. Make pilot K-6 schools
4. Pioneer and Farr Avenue elementary schools—make one a K-3 and make the other a 4-5
5. Unify with the high school district
6. Designate only one child per household to bring home school/district notices
7. Limit students moving from school to school since days are lost during the transition
8. Increase outside printing jobs to bring in more revenue
9. Revamp custodial coverage at schools; shift custodial duties at schools to school staff and students for routine cleaning and custodians do more thorough cleaning once weekly

10. Increase efforts to get attendance up; follow up with parents sooner for students with attendance issues; SARB parents after three absences; provide a flu shot program for students and increase ADA
11. Reduce school week to 4 days, 10 hours a day
12. Grounds keeping biweekly instead of weekly
13. No Maintenance overtime (incentive for working faster)
14. Increase employee attendance, especially when it means hiring a substitute
15. Increase employee efficiency; monitor doing personal things during work time, especially if employee is claiming overtime
16. Cut back on expenses associated with Employee Recognition event; move event to school site; solicit donations for awards, refreshments, flowers, etc.
17. Close Felicita and move students to Miller or vice versa; close Miller and distribute students and staff among Bernardo, Felicita, and L. R. Green
18. Close a school or two and sell property
19. Cut back on supplies; ask for parent/community donations; purchase small pencils used at golf courses; instead of supplying all students with basic supplies, just give them to students who haven't brought their own
20. Cancel summer school
24. Eliminate ELD coaches; reduce all coaches
25. Rent or use online textbooks versus purchasing
26. Actively solicit corporate sponsors
27. Offer certification programs at the district instead of requiring conference attendance
28. Reduce School Library Techs to half time and have teachers check out books to their own students
29. Centralize School Computer Techs and send them to schools based on need; replace School Computer Techs with qualified teachers
30. Have two sets of math texts (one for school, one for home) if it reduces the cost of printing

31. Generate revenue by: offering summer camps, renting facilities, parent grant-writing groups, relax restrictions on fund-raising
32. Reduce Ed Center work week to 4 days; change work hours at Ed Center from 7:30-3:30 or 8:00-4:00 with half-hour lunch; close the Ed Center one month in summer
33. Realign boundaries to eliminate as many relocatable classrooms as possible throughout the district
34. House Opportunity at education center
35. Deliver district mail to employees internally rather than through USPS; reduce staff time placing notices in staff mailboxes by timing notices with payroll checks
36. Replace publications supervisor with purchasing director for oversight of that department
37. Eliminate all clerical substitutes at the education center before reducing or eliminating permanent positions
38. Relieve Accounting department of responsibility for First Years/preschool programs by hiring an accountant using categorical funds received for these programs

#### **Required by the State Department**

1. Replace Power School if it's costing too much
2. Increase class size reduction numbers from 20 to 24

#### **Special Funding Needed**

1. Make summer Reading First trainings optional, especially for veteran teachers
2. Consider eliminating K-3 class size reduction
3. No curriculum adoptions until California's budget is in better shape
4. Reduce or eliminate BTSA requirements; instead provide new teachers support at their site through mentor teachers
5. Reduce or eliminate the need for subs for teachers doing DAIT visits; reduce or eliminate all requirements for teachers to be out of classroom requiring subs
